

Beloved in Christ,

As I am writing this I am just about two weeks into my sabbatical time. I'm pretty sure this is the longest I have been away from work since my junior year in high school when over April vacation the youth group here at St. John's went on a mission trip to North Carolina and the week we returned I went on vacation with my family for a week. So far my time has pretty much been split in three ways.

First, as I mentioned over the past months, part of what I wanted to do with this time was walk all the streets in Barrington, or at least attempt to. I am quickly learning that this is something I will be attempting and not finishing. At around seventeen miles walked I have only covered about one third of the Hampden Meadows area.

I have also been taking a class at RIC on Nonprofit finances. A lot of this class has focused on the IRS Form 990. Unlike most nonprofit, churches are exempt from filing this form, which means that a lot of the information is new to me, but also not terribly applicable to what we do. There has, however, been some good stuff from the class.

Finally, I have been taking time to recharge. I've been taking more time to read, watch movies, and play video games than I normally would be able to. It has been nice to mentally unplug in this way, but I am excited to be getting active again.

Tomorrow I jump out of sabbatical mode as I travel to Louisville, KY for General Convention. General Convention is the triennial meeting of the Episcopal Church. Deputations from every diocese of the Episcopal Church will gather for just over a week to take council and do the business of the church. Here we will vote on issues that affect our life in the Episcopal Church together and adopt a budget for the next three years. General Convention is similar to our Diocesan Convention, but for the entire church. One hundred and eleven dioceses will each send a deputation of four clergy members and four lay members to make up the House of Deputies, as well as their Bishops to make up the House of Bishops. One exciting part of this year's convention is that the House of Bishop's will be electing a new Presiding Bishop. The term for Presiding Bishop is nine years, and as Bishop Curry was elected in 2015 his term is up this year. While in most matters both Houses have an equal say in what is being discussed, for the election of Presiding Bishop the House of Bishop's votes on the candidates and the House of Deputies confirms the election.

Ancient Practices Series

Beginning this fall we gather once a month to discuss the books in the Ancient Practice Series. This eight book series includes an introductory book followed by seven books that look at practices of the church that not only have been a part of Christianity since our origins but are also shared with the major faith traditions of the world. The books are: Finding Our Way Again: The Return of the Ancient Practices; In Constant Prayer; Sabbath; Fasting; The Sacred Meal; The Liturgical Year: The Spiraling Adventure of the Spiritual Life; The Sacred Journey; and Tithing: Test Me in This. Starting in August we will have a few copies of each book available at the church for those who would like to borrow one rather than purchase their own. In September we will gather on Sunday, the 8th at 6:30 to discuss Finding Our Way Again: The Return of the Ancient Practices written by Brian McLaren. I hope you will join us in the coming months as we dive deeper into the practices of our faith.

Confirmation Class

Bishop Knisely will be making his visitation with us this year on Sunday, October 6 th . When a Bishop visits we have the option of including Confirmations, receptions, or reaffirmations of baptismal vows. We often have confirmations of our high school youth who are around the age of 16, this rite, however, is not just for youth but everyone. Any adults who have not been confirmed, or were confirmed in a tradition that does not have Bishops in apostolic succession, are strongly encouraged to consider it. Reception into the church is for anyone who was confirmed in another tradition by a Bishop in apostolic succession, and reaffirmation is for anyone who has been confirmed or received but would like to make a formal recommitment to our way of life.

Anyone in the parish who would like to take part in one of these rites, or to learn more about them, is encouraged to reach out to Fr. Patrick. In early August we will come up with a schedule of classes that will take place from late August through September to prepare for these rites.

Weekday Morning Services

While Fr. Patrick is on sabbatical our morning weekday services, Morning Prayer Monday - Thursday and the Wednesday Eucharist, will not take place. These services will resume Monday August 5th..
