

Beloved in Christ,

There's a good chance that if you go into the nave and pick a prayer book out of pew then let it open up on its own, it'll open somewhere around page 355, the beginning of the Eucharist. This might not be true of all of them, but I bet a surprising number of them will do this. It makes sense that these particular prayer books open up so readily to this service, week in and week out that is what they're used for. Every so often they might be used for a baptism or funeral, but week after week they're opened to page 355, and they show that regular use.

While it makes sense that these particular prayer books open so readily to these pages, their tendency to do so speaks to how we are familiar with certain aspects of our tradition while other aspects often go overlooked. Our prayer book contains gifts of our tradition that we too often overlook. And that's just our prayer book, in addition to the Book of Common Prayer, we have the Book of Occasional Services. It's not exactly what they mean, but their titles speak to the frequency of their use and thus how well they're known.

All this is to say that we have a lot of hidden gems in our tradition. A lot of services that we do not make use of enough. One of these hidden gems that I highlight a couple times of year is our Blessing in Homes. We have a big service for this that processes from room to room and culminates with the Eucharist in the living room, which can take place pretty much any time. We also have a couple shorter services that take a matter of minutes. One at Epiphany, which includes the chalking of the doors and is offered from the Feast of the Epiphany on January 6th until Lent begins, and one during the season of Easter, which runs for fifty days from Easter Sunday up until Pentecost.

If you would like to talk about having your home blessed, whether through the longer service culminating with the Eucharist or the quick Easter blessing I am always happy to do so. Pentecost this year falls on Sunday, May 19th so the Easter blessing can take place any time between now and then.

The Chamber Orchestra of Barrington at St. John's will be performing on Sunday April 21, at 3:00. Remember to get there early, as the church fill up fast!!



The Chamber Orchestra of Barrington at St. Johns presents a program featuring a fanfare, two iconic symphonies, and a work for a rare combination; harmonica and brass.

The program opens with Aaron Copland's "Fanfare for the Common Man," a work composed in 1942 to bolster the American patriotic spirit shortly after the country's entry into WWII. Next on the program is Charles Ives' Symphony No. 3, which was completed in 1910 but not performed until 1946. It won for the composer the 1947 Pulitzer Prize in Music. Our featured soloist, Chris Turner, a world class harmonica virtuoso, will perform Rhode Island composer Paul Nelson's "William Street Blues," commissioned in 1998 for Mr. Turner by the RI Philharmonic Orchestra. This performance is only the second in the work's existence. Rounding out the program is W.A. Mozart's magnificent Symphony No. 41 in C Major, the "Jupiter," the composer's last and, arguably, greatest symphony.
