

Beloved,

Ash Wednesday this year falls on February 14th . Happy Valentine's Day and remember that to dust you shall return... this is actually a little fitting as St. Valentine was a martyr of the early church. It is believed that Chaucer is responsible for Valentine being the patron saint of lovers, nearly one thousand years after Valentine's martyrdom. So again, Happy Valentine's Day and remember that to dust you shall return. Ash Wednesday holds one of my favorite liturgical moments as a priest. Early in our service I get to offer the invitation to a holy Lent. This invitation ends with the following words:

I invite you, therefore, in the name of the Church, to the observance of a holy Lent, by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and by reading and meditating God's holy Word.

While Lent may not be everyone's favorite part of our calendar there is something special about the intentionality and focus on repentance and drawing closer to our God. That is why this invitation to the observance of a holy Lent is one of my favorite liturgical moments of the whole year. In a recent sermon Deacon Michele mentioned that clergy stand as spiritual landscapers cultivating the space for you to grow in your faith (I may have heard that first as spiritual lightsabers and was very confused, but got it at the next service). That is what this invitation is all about, helping you to create the space to grow closer with our God. That is what is so special about Lent, there is a more explicit emphasis on making room for our faith and for our God.

This Ash Wednesday we will be adding to our regular schedule of Drive-Thru Ashes from 7-8:30 and traditional Ash Wednesday services at 9:30am and 7pm. Our addition this year will be a Family Ash Wednesday service at 5pm. Children and families are of course welcome at any service, but the new 5pm service will be geared toward them.

Throughout Lent we will once again be holding a Lenten Program on Wednesday evenings. We will gather for a service of Holy Eucharist at 5:30pm. Following this service we will have a light soup and salad supper, beginning around 6pm, and this will be followed by our program. This year we will be looking at a few different bible passages through the lens of TED talks. If you are unfamiliar

CONCERT: SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 18, 2024, 3:00 PM

The Chamber Orchestra of Barrington at St. John's, conducted by Music Director Edward Markward, will present a concert celebrating **Black History Month** on Sunday, February 18th at 3 pm at St. John's Episcopal Church, Barrington. The program opens with the "Overture to L'Amant Anonyme" (The Anonymous Lover) by Joseph Bologne, Chevalier de Saint Georges, a French violinist, conductor, composer and soldier. He was the first composer of African descent to achieve wide European acclaim. "Lyric for Strings," by George Walker, rivals Samuel Barbers "Adagio" for its sheer beauty and poignancy. Walker was the first African American to win the Pulitzer Prize for Music. Award-winning composer Florence Price, the first African American woman to have a work performed by a major American symphony Orchestra (Chicago Symphony Orchestra, 1933), is represented by two works: "Suite of Dances" and "Andante Moderato," arranged for strings by the composer from her First String Quartet. Rounding out the program will be Ludwig van Beethoven's Symphony No. 1 in C Major, sometimes called the composer's "farewell to the 18th century."


