

Beloved in Christ,

Earlier this year I had hoped we would have our Director of Music Programs position filled by the beginning of the fall. As summer was ending and it was clear that wouldn't be happening I was hoping for someone to be in place for Advent. Unfortunately that did not happen either.

The search committee and I have interviewed three candidates. At the end of October we made an offer to the candidate we felt was best qualified for the job. This candidate discerned, however, that this position was not the right one for him. He loved working with our choir and search committee, and he was very clear his decision was not about anything negative about St. John's but mostly coming from his lack of experience in traditional liturgical worship. His experience in church music was very different from what we do so he thought it best to decline our offer.

Given the time of year we are aware we will not be filling the position before 2025. With the holiday season approaching we are aware that church musicians are especially busy right now. After the holidays we plan to pick up the search again.

I want to thank Christine Wallis for leading us on the piano over these past months. Our lack of applicants for the permanent position mirrors the lack of organist subs as well. There are many weeks we would not have had music without Christine's willingness to step in for us. She has done a wonderful job leading our worship music over the past months and I am incredibly thankful for that.

For the month of December, including, Christmas Eve, we will have a long term sub, Jean-Marc Schweizer. In January, Jean-Marc will be beginning a permanent position at a Congregational Church in Massachusetts. As you see Jean-Marc on Sundays this month and on Christmas Eve please make sure to welcome him to St. John's. Our music programs may not be what we have come to be used to this Advent and Christmas, but I assure you we will continue, as the Psalmist writes, to make a joyful noise to the Lord.
