

# This Old Church: Tuesday, September 3rd, I Did Nothing!

It's Tuesday, September 3rd, right after Labor Day weekend and I'm just about to begin my day here at St. John's. I like to come in early and get a jump on the day. It's nice and quiet and I get a lot done before the troops arrive – I love it! But this was not destined to be one of those days.

Three, two, one...

As I pushed the big green door open, I could hear the blaring of our fire alarm. Darn, I knew I should stayed home! Fortunately, our alarm system is connected directly to the Fire Department. With no apparent smoke or fire detected, I stepped outside to wait for them. Soon, the sirens were wailing down Country Road, it's 7AM, as a caravan of emergency vehicles descend on St. John's. A big hook and ladder truck blocked traffic at the plaza entrance and began hooking hoses to the hydrant on the corner, (standard procedure for a building like ours... just in case.) A rescue parked alongside the Memorial Garden, and a pumper strategically positioned themselves in the middle of the parking lot, apparently readying for a fight. A police car sat in the driveway and another at the entrance. I suddenly felt very small, but very grateful. Procedure dictates the Fire Department inspect the entire building before reactivating the alarm, so I had firemen crawling all over the place. Ya know, I should been a fireman; ringing that bell, petting the dalmatian, making homemade beans. How cool is THAT! "Relax," the captain said, "it's just a malfunction in the fire alarm panel." Whew, a quick call to our fire protection company and I'm back to my ordinary, quiet day.

Oh, yeah proof. Oh, no.

Only an hour into my "quiet " day and I had met with five more contractors. John Anderson Drain Cleaning pulled up to flush out a clogged down spout and drain between Encore and our side door.

No sooner had I got them up and running when an electrical subcontractor from Alert Fire Protection came through the door to assess our broken kitchen exhaust fan, which vents our kitchen stove. I had a ladder at the ready because I thought he might not be prepared to climb, not knowing the motor was located on the roof.

I had just gotten the ladder in position when I heard the familiar voice of our general electrician, Neal Bellavance, who came to trouble shoot our exterior flood lights that light up the front of the church. This became a massive investigation, trying to trace ancient wiring through ancient walls, but we have an ancient electrician... and he's good! Our beautiful church is once again illuminated at night for all to enjoy.

Next came a conversation with our landscaper, Joe Parker, about cutting back some of the saplings and brush on our north driveway, which were beginning to overhang and interfere with travel. So off we go to appraise that work. We talked about being aggressive with the cutting, so he wouldn't need to revisit the problem again, in three years.

It's now 9:00, and everybody's working away. Me? I spent the rest of the morning running between all these guys, making sure they hadn't encountered any unforeseen problems... fortunately, everything went smoothly.

Now, if you haven't been counting contractors... that totals six, and all before 9AM! Hey, what happened to my" quiet" morning?

Dale and Fr. Patrick pitched in, offering some valuable historical info to assist with all the work and that made everything flow smoother and faster. (One tiny problem,  $oldsymbol{o}$  I had to translate some words for the contractors – like "thingamabob," "doohickey," and "little red thing," but I'm grateful to Dale and Pat for their assistance.)

One last thing, before I let you go. On Tuesday, September 3rd , from 7AM to 12 noon... I did nothing!

Hey, it's all in a day's work! (sometimes)
